Argentine Bahia Grass



Argentine Bahia has wider broader leaves with a good darker green color then Pensacola. It is a more desirable turf then Pensacola but is more susceptible to the cold weather with a higher chance for winterkill. It is used very commonly for lawns, because of it's attractive look and the fact that it produces less seed heads then Pensacola.

Argentine Bahia can also be used in coastal areas for pasture. For coastal regions it is a better choice then Pensacola because of it's ability to stand better then Pensacola in wetter conditions.

Argentine Bahia grass is an excellent choice for both turf and pastures because it is relatively easy to maintain. It is very drought tolerant and will easily survive with little maintenance. It is commonly used in the Southeastern United States and is recommended for areas with similar climatic conditions.

New Lawns - Plant 5 to 10 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft. Pasture Applications: Plant 25 to 100 lbs. per acre.

*The more seed applied to the lawn or pasture on the first planting the faster the lawn or pasture will fully establish a sod or grass base and prevent future over seeding to fill in bare spots.
